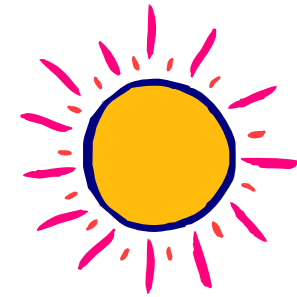
Babysitting Classes Offered!
